Priorities 2024/2025

- Improve school climate to enhance a better sense of belonging and maintain the percentage of students feeling moderate to severe bullying below the Canadian norm percentages.
- Continued efforts on ensuring social emotional needs are addressed, for students to feel safe, by using trauma-informed practices with our students.
- Maintain and develop an ongoing dialogue to address bullying and perceptions of bullying

Our School Survey Results Continued:

- Review and analysis of documentation of the Our School Survey and comparing last year's results 2023/24 to the current May 2024/25 report, the number of bullying and violence incidents has *decreased*.
- Specifically, there was 65% of students reported being victims of bullying and violence in November 2023/24, and this reduced to 47% of students recorded incidents in May 2025.
- Our analysis permits us to observe that the number of incidents related to bullying has decreased from last year's November 2023/2024 results to May 2025 results. physical bullying from 30% to 18%, verbal bullying from 36% to 32%, social bullying 51% to 34%, cyber from 9% to 8%.
- There has been a reduction in the number of events related to bullying and violence in the different areas of the school. The school is proud to present, that there is no longer bullying and violence reported: in the hallway (dropping 11% to 0%), locker rooms (dropping 6% to 0%), washrooms (dropping 14% to 0%), and cafeteria (dropping 8% to 0%), and on the bus (dropping 11% to 0%).
- There was an increase in the percentage of occurrences in the classrooms from 6% to 20%, and as well outside of the school increasing from 44% to 60%.
- The occurrence of most bullying and violence happens during recesses, however, the number of incidents decreased from 2023/2024 results to this May 2025, from 64% to 50%. However increased after school from 11% to 25%. *Future Prevention Incentives in 2025/2026 will focus on lowering the percentages during these specific time periods.*
- The school staff attributes this decrease in overall occurrences of the results in May 2025, is due to an increase in the number of group activities and building community.
- The priority of improving school climate to enhance a better sense of belonging, and maintain the percentage of students feeling moderate to severe bullying below the Canadian norm percentages was successful. In 2023/24 bullying and violence incidents mean average was 6.4% higher than the Canadian norm, and in May 2025, it was reduced lower than the average by .07%.
